I became a volunteer at the railway having moved to the area in 2017 and can be found most weeks guarding passenger trains. My passion for steam railways is in the blood – three generations of Nibloes served on the Great Eastern Railway, starting with my 3xgreat grandfather in the 1840s.

I joined the Finance Committee in 2019 and at the K&ESR AGM that year I was appointed to the Board.

Prior to moving to within walking distance of Bodiam station in 2017, I spent a thirty-year career at HSBC Bank. I have sought to contribute the skills and experience that I gained in my professional life for the benefit of our Railway as together we have operated the charity in a time of unprecedented challenge from the external environment.

During my career I was a commercial manager and divisional credit manager, dealing with organisations such as our own as they planned for the future, expanded, and in some cases sought to turn around unsustainable performance.
