3. Financial Overview and Sustainability Focus Financial Health Summary

In 2024, our income sources were diverse, with ticket sales, donations, special events, and membership fees contributing to our revenue. The **50th Anniversary events** significantly boosted both visitor engagement and income, underscoring the value of milestone celebrations in attracting support. However, despite these positive gains, **operational costs** continue to rise, driven by expenses for maintenance, fuel, and compliance with modern regulations, which impact our ability to reinvest in future growth.

Cost Management & Future Strategy

In response to these rising costs K&ESR has implemented wherever possible, and where safety is not compromised, cost-saving measures across all key areas. Energy savings and not filling certain vacancies have helped to reduce our expenses, though not without consequences in spreading workload. However, further work is still needed to ensure longer term sustainable cost controls. We are also exploring ways to streamline some processes and improve resource allocation, enabling us to meet immediate needs while planning for long-term stability.

Future Financial Goals

Looking ahead, our financial strategy is focused on expanding revenue streams beyond our core visitor market through **targeted funding campaigns** and **new partnerships**. Plans for more **themed events** and collaborative community activities will help diversify our income sources. Additionally, we aim to launch specific fundraising efforts that directly support capital projects essential to K&ESR's future.

Our financial goals are driven by a commitment to long-term sustainability. By actively managing costs and pursuing innovative revenue opportunities, we are building a foundation that will allow K&ESR to thrive for years to come.

4. The Robertsbridge Extension and Strategic Plans for 2025 Progress Update

The **Robertsbridge extension** remains one of K&ESR's most transformative projects, set to expand our reach and secure the railway's long-term viability. Once completed, this extension will open new opportunities for both visitor growth and heritage tourism, creating a seamless connection from Tenterden to Robertsbridge. This vision has been decades in the making, and RVR have made significant strides this year, from advancing technical preparations, such as level crossings, to formalising collaboration with the K&ESR through the signing of a **Memorandum of Understanding** on 31 May 2024.

Balancing this ambitious project with day-to-day operations remains a priority. With rising costs and volunteer shortages, it's critical to allocate resources effectively, ensuring both the continuation of current services and steady progress on Robertsbridge.

Looking Ahead to 2025

Our goals for 2025 focus on preparing K&ESR for sustainable growth. Key areas of focus include:

- Volunteer Recruitment and Retention: Recruiting and supporting a larger volunteer base is essential for managing increased demand and achieving our operational goals. Our strategy includes targeted outreach and retention efforts to make volunteering accessible, rewarding, and community-focused.
- **Event Expansion**: Building on the success of this year's events, we plan to broaden our event offerings, with more themed experiences and seasonal highlights that appeal to a wide audience. Expanding events will not only bring in additional revenue but also strengthen our community ties and visitor engagement. These include a Diesel Gala, Midgets of Steam and a celebration of the 25th anniversary of the opening to Bodiam.
- Infrastructure Improvements: Alongside the Robertsbridge extension, we will continue essential infrastructure upgrades across the railway. This includes ongoing track and facility maintenance, improvements to visitor amenities, and enhancements to operational safety and efficiency.

2025 promises to be a pivotal year as we pursue these goals to strengthen K&ESR's foundation and prepare for the next phase of growth. With a collaborative spirit and focused approach, we can turn our vision for K&ESR into a sustainable reality.
